## **Chellanam Fishing Village**

(Chellanam Grama Panchayat - Palluruthy Block)

## A Brief Profile of the Chellanam Fishing Villages

Chellanam fisheries village is spread over four wards of Chellanam Gram Panchayat. According to the map provided by the GP and based on the interactions held with the President, elected members of the GP and the Panchayat officials, the coastal wards of this village are 14, 15, 16 and 17.

Towards arriving at the socio-economic profile of the fisheries village, different sources of data like census reports, published documents on coastal area, interviews with the elected members from the geographical constituencies from the coastal area, interactions with the officials from Gram Panchayat, Fisheries Department and other Government departments, Focus Group Discussions with the village community, etc. were considered.

The village has a total of 950 houses and 1101 households are living there. Among them, 163 are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 32.11 percent houses are pucca, 55.47 percent are semi-pucca and 12.42 percent houses are kachha houses. About 81.05 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 73.68 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (97.37 %) are electrified. It is noted that 506 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 49 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 19 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one PHC. The village has two LP Schools and one High School. Eight anganawadis are functioning in this village and six of them are functioning in its own building. This village has 4 roads of 4.50 km length. The village has 25 street lights and only six of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 135 country fishing boats and 5 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 19 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one fish market. The village has a protected coastal line of 2.905 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.

The results of situation analysis and needs and requirements are presented in Tables 1 and 2 while the financial requirements are given in Table 3.
