## Mayyanadu Fishing Village

## (Mayyanadu Grama Panchayat - Mugathala Block)

## A Brief Profile of the Mayyanadu Fishing Village

Mayyanadu fisheries village is spread over two wards of Mayyanadu Gram Panchayat. The coastal wards of this village are 12 and 13. The village has a total of 170 houses and 173 households are living there. Among them, 6 households are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 79.41 percent houses are pucca, 11.77 percent are semi-pucca and 8.82 percent houses are kachha houses. About 79.41 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 67.06 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (96.47 %) are electrified. It is noted that 105 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 11 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 5 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has no hospital facilities. The village has one UP School. Six anganawadis are functioning in this village and three of them are functioning in rented buildings. This village has a network of 7 roads of 15 Km length, 1 Km drainage and three culverts. The village has 100 street lights and 70 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 18 country fishing boats and 57 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 79 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has two markets. The village has an unprotected coastal line of 1.704 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.

The results of situation analysis and needs and financial requirements are presented in Tables 4 and 5.
