A Brief Profile of the Paravoor South Fishing Village

Paravoor South fisheries village is spread over four wards of Paravoor Municipality. According to the map provided by the GP and based on the interactions held with the President, elected members of the GP and the Panchayat officials, the coastal wards of this village are 16, 17, 18 and 20.

Towards arriving at the socio-economic profile of the fisheries village, different sources of data like census reports, published documents on coastal area, interviews with the elected members from the geographical constituencies from the coastal area, interactions with the officials from Gram Panchayat, Fisheries Department and other Government departments, Focus Group Discussions with the village community, etc. were considered.

The village has a total of 950 houses and 953 households are living there. Among them, 5 are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 41.26 percent houses are pucca, 57.37 percent are semi-pucca and 1.37 percent houses are kachha houses. About 93.16 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 88.95 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (98.74 %) are electrified. It is noted that 343 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 18 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 8 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has no hospital facility. The village has one UP School and one High School. Four anganawadis are functioning in this village and three of them are functioning in its own building. This village has 11 roads of 15.80 km length, 0.150 Km drainage and 2 culverts. The village has 180 street lights and only 25 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 26 country fishing boats and two mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 20 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one fish market. The village has a protected coastal line of 0.950 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are acute in this village.
