

## **Quilandy Fishing Village** (Quilandy Municipality)

### ***A Brief Profile of the Quilandy Fishing Villages***

Quilandy fisheries village is spread over three wards of Quilandy Municipality. The coastal wards of this village are 34, 36 and 37. The village has a total of 538 houses and 584 households are living there. Among them, 53 households are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 53.16 percent houses are pucca, 36.62 percent are semi-pucca and 10.22 percent houses are kachha houses. About 97.40 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 76.95 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (95.72 %) are electrified. It is noted that 239 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 8 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 2 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one Taluk hospital. The village has one LP School and two UP Schools. Seven anganawadis are functioning in this village and two of them are functioning in own buildings. This village has a network of 6 roads of length 8.25 Km, 1.00 Km drainage and five culverts. The village has 40 street lights and 16 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 54 country fishing boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 69 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one harbour (under construction) and one fish landing centre. The village has three ice plants and one market. The village has a protected coastal length of 3 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are acute in this village.

The results of situation analysis and needs and financial requirements are presented in Tables 60 and 61.
