

## **Vanmughom Kadaloor Moodady Fishing Village**

(Moodady Gram Panchayath - Panthalayani Block)

### ***A Brief Profile of the Vanmughom Kadaloor Moodady Fishing Village***

Vanmughom Kadaloor Moodadi fisheries village is spread over six wards of Moodady Gram Panchayath. The coastal wards of this village are 1, 13,14,15,16 and 17. The village has a total of 740 houses and 821 households are living there. Among them, 93 households are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 61.08 percent houses are pucca, 35.14 percent are semi-pucca and 3.78 percent houses are kachha houses. About 96.89 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 84.86 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (94.59 %) are electrified. It is noted that 320 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 19 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 7 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has no hospital facilities. The village has one UP School. Eight anganawadis are functioning in this village and five of them are functioning in own buildings. This village has a network of 25 roads of length 17.95 Km, 0.29 Km drainage and three culverts. The village has 9 street lights and all of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 157 country fishing boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 86 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one ice plant. The village has a coastal length of 4.5 Km out of which 3.3 Km is protected. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.
