(Parappanangadi GP-Thiroorangadi Block)

A Brief Profile of the Ariyalloor Fishing Village

Ariyalloor Beach fisheries village is spread over two wards of Vallikkunnu Gram Panchayat. The coastal wards of this village are 17 and 18. The village has a total of 192 houses and 210 households are living there. Among them, 23 are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 50 percent houses are pucca, 33.85 percent are semi-pucca and 16.15 percent houses are kachha houses. About 80.73 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 93.75 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (94.79 %) are electrified. It is noted that 104 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 28 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 9 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one sub-centre. The village has one UP School and one Higher Secondary School. Five anganawadis are functioning in this village and four of them are functioning in its own building. This village has 12 roads of 9.550 km length, 1 km drainage and two culverts. The village has 30 street lights and only 12 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 23 country fishing boats and 4 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 22 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one landing centre and it is not functional. The village has one ice plant. The village has coastal line of 2.2 Km and it is unprotected. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.
