

Kadappuram Fishing Village

(Kadappuram Grama Panchayat - Chavakkadu Block)

A Brief Profile of the Kadappuram Fishing Villages

Kadappuram fisheries village is spread over nine wards of Kadappuram Gram Panchayat. The coastal wards of this village are 1, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14. The village has a total of 1840 houses and 1882 households are living there. Among them, 52 are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 17.66 percent houses are pucca, 71.47 percent are semi-pucca and 10.87 percent houses are kachha houses. About 94.13 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 92.93 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (97.39 %) are electrified. It is noted that 472 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 54 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 12 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one PHC and one Sub-centre. The village has one LP School, one UP School, two Higher Secondary School and one Fisheries Technical School. Seventeen anganawadis are functioning in this village and eleven of them are functioning in its own building. This village has 17 roads of 16.95 km length and 0.30 Km drainage. The village has 250 street lights and only 75 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 60 country fishing boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 48 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one landing centre. The village has a protected coastal line of 3.75 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.
